1. Call To Order

The meeting was called to order at 10:02 a.m.

2. Introductions

There were no introductions.

3. Review and approve minutes of the December 4, 2024 meeting

Ms. Max made a correction to item 6b, stating that she provided the report. Mr. Bredehoft made a motion to approve the minutes of December 4, 2024, as corrected. The motion was seconded by Mr. Chang and carried unanimously.

4. Receive public comments on specific issues related to agenda items 5 through 7

There were no comments.

5. Planning Group Membership

a. Discuss and consider taking action to elect officers and members of the Executive Committee of the Region H Water Planning Group (RHWPG).

Mr. Chang, Chair of the Nominating Committee, stated that the Nominating Committee met on February 5, 2025, and recommended that all current officers and the executive committee remain the same. It was explained that the officers and the two members at-large make up the Executive Committee. Mr. Evans announced that the officers and executive committee members are Mark Evans, Chair; Marvin Marcell, Vice Chair; John Bartos, Secretary; David Bailey, Member at-Large; Arthur Bredehoft, Member at-Large. Mr. Brunett made a motion to accept the recommendation by the Nominating Committee for the Officers and the Executive Committee members to remain the same. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kramer and carried unanimously.

With no objection, Mr. Evans announced that item 6e of the Addendum, would be discussed prior to item 6a.

6. Plan Development and Administration

- e. **Receive report from the Water Management Strategy Committee on issues related to water supply and potential future water management strategies.**

Mr. Bartos stated that prior to reviewing the details of the water management strategies, discussion ensued regarding the transportation of excess water from this region to other regions. He explained that Mr. Eyerly provided information related to this topic. Mr. Bartos stated that the Water Management Strategy Committee met and feel very comfortable and confident with the Water Management Strategies proposed in the report.

- a. **Receive update from the Consultant Team regarding the draft 2026 Region H Initially Prepared Regional Water Plan (IPP).**

Mr. Taucer provided a brief summary of the chapters within the IPP. He explained that the Water Management Strategies Committee reviewed the updates to the IPP and provided certain recommendations related to WMS category figures, key WMS table clarifications, clarifications on methodology and savings potential, and highlight demand management success stories. He stated that following the IPP, there will be a large number of small changes that will take place.

- b. **Consider and adopt the IPP and approve the Consultant Team to prepare final copies of the IPP and supporting documentation and submit to Texas Water Development Board (“TWDB”) no later than March 3, 2025.**

Ms. Max made a motion to adopt the IPP and approve the Consultant Team to prepare final copies of the IPP and supporting documentation and submit to TWDB no later than March 3, 2025. The motion was seconded by Mr. Bredehoft and carried unanimously.

- c. **Receive update from Consultant Team regarding public hearings.**

Mr. Taucer discussed the possible dates and locations for the public hearings.

- d. **Discuss and take action on approval of public hearing schedule for presentation of the 2026 Region H IPP and authorize the San Jacinto River Authority and the Consulting Team to prepare and mail notices related to public hearings.**

Mr. Taucer explained that the water planning group will schedule three separate meetings, one to the north, one to the south, and one at the San Jacinto River Authority in Conroe. Mr. Langford made a motion to approve the public hearing schedule for the presentation of the 2026 Region H IPP and authorize the San Jacinto River Authority and Consulting Team to prepare and mail notices related to the public hearings. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kramer and carried unanimously.

7. General Updates and Outreach

- a. **Receive update regarding schedule and milestones for the development of the 2026 Region H Regional Water Plan.**

Mr. Taucer provided an overview of the schedule and milestones, explaining that the shift is now on public outreach and discussions with stakeholders. He stated that the IPP is due March 3rd, and the public hearings will take place in April or May.

b. Receive updates from liaisons to other planning groups.

Ms. Max provided an update related to the Region 6 Flood Planning Group and Mr. Ashmore stated that GMA 14 is beginning the DFC planning process.

c. Receive report regarding recent and upcoming activities related to communications and outreach efforts on behalf of the RHWPG.

d. Receive update from TWDB

Ms. Rose provided updates from TWDB regarding staff changes and details related to the IPP public hearings.

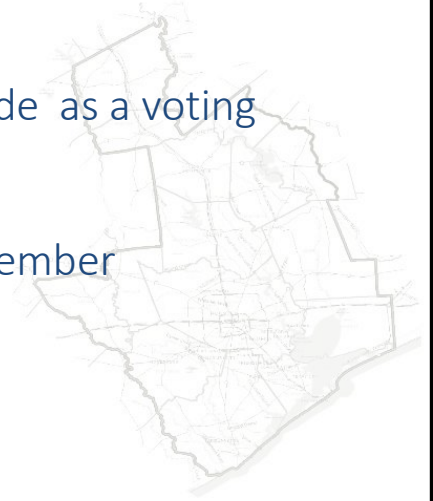

The Region H Water Planning Group (WPG) is hereby giving notice of a vacancy on the Region H Water Planning Group for a voting member representing water utilities. The Region H WPG may consider making an appointment to fill this vacancy on or after May 7, 2025. The term of this appointment ends in 2026.

Background:

The Region H WPG was established by appointment of an initial coordinating body by the TWDB on February 19, 1998, and one subsequent additional appointment by the initial coordinating body. The purpose of the Region H WPG shall be to provide comprehensive regional water planning and to carry out the related responsibilities placed on regional water planning groups by state law, including Texas Water Code Chapter 16 and TWDB rules, including 31 TAC Chapters 355, 357, and 358, in and for the Region H Water Planning Area (WPA).

Responsibilities:

The Region H WPG shall have the responsibility for performing the functions defined in Texas Water Code, Chapter 16 and in 31 TAC Chapters 355, 357, and 358 related to regional water planning groups for the Region H WPA. Foremost among those responsibilities shall be the development of a regional water plan for the Region H WPA that identifies both short and long-term water supply needs and recommends water management strategies for addressing them.

Conditions of Membership:

In order to be eligible for voting membership on the Region H WPG, a person must represent the interest for which a member is sought, be willing to participate in the regional water planning process, and abide by the bylaws.

Socioeconomic Impact Analysis of Not Meeting Water Needs in the Regional Water Plans

Unreliable or insufficient water supplies would negatively impact existing businesses and industry, future economic development efforts, as well as public health and safety within Texas. To recognize the importance of water for the State, Regional Water Planning Groups (RWPG) are required by Texas Administrative Code §357.33 and §357.40 to evaluate the economic and social impacts of not meeting projected water needs (potential shortages) in their regional water plans.

At the request of the RWPGs, the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) performed a socioeconomic impact assessment of not mitigating future water needs in the event of a single year repeat of the drought of record for each of the 16 RWPGs. Impact results are reported for each Water Use Category with identified water needs. Water use categories include irrigation, livestock, manufacturing, mining, municipal and steam electric power.

Primary impact measures include lost income, jobs, and taxes, while supplemental measures address losses of utility revenue, consumer surplus, population, and school enrollment, as well as estimates of water hauling costs and additional purchases of electrical power.

The impact assessment for the primary measures is based on an input-output modeling approach, which relies on proprietary software known as IMPLAN. Sixteen planning region-specific IMPLAN models are developed to derive estimates of income, jobs, and taxes present in each area of interest.

The preliminary IMPLAN values are then combined with TWDB water use estimates within each sector to determine the value per acre-foot of use, and the resulting estimates are combined with region-specific IMPLAN multipliers to determine regional level estimates, taking into account the indirect impacts. Final impact estimates are obtained by adjusting for the degree of water shortage (assuming that adverse impact of water needs would likely vary depending upon the severity of a shortage), and then multiplying by the acre-feet of water needs within the sector.

Impact estimates for the supplemental measures

generally involve combining sector-specific data with the acre-feet of needs. Over thirty major sources of data from State, Federal and local sources, as well as output from the sixteen IMPLAN models, were employed in developing the primary and supplemental impact measure estimates.

The resulting impact estimates vary with the degree of shortage, are planning region-specific, and reflect the variability of the various types of economic activity within each county.

Assumptions and Limitations:

- The analysis focuses on sectors with adequate water use data.
- Results are based on the static structure of the economy implicit within the IMPLAN data used.
- Impact estimates are a snapshot which might occur during a single year in drought of record conditions, and do not consider possible impacts of multi-year droughts.
- Spillover impacts on adjoining regions are not considered.
- Forwardly linked impacts within the economy are not considered.
- Possible building moratoriums, which address long term shortages, are not addressed within the analysis.
- All values are reported in the same dollar values as capital costs in the plans to be consistent with water management strategy cost estimates.

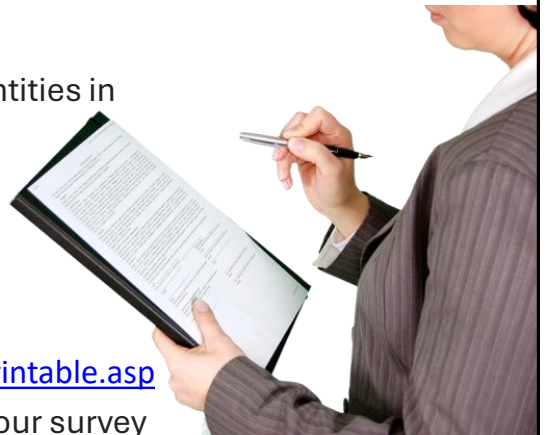

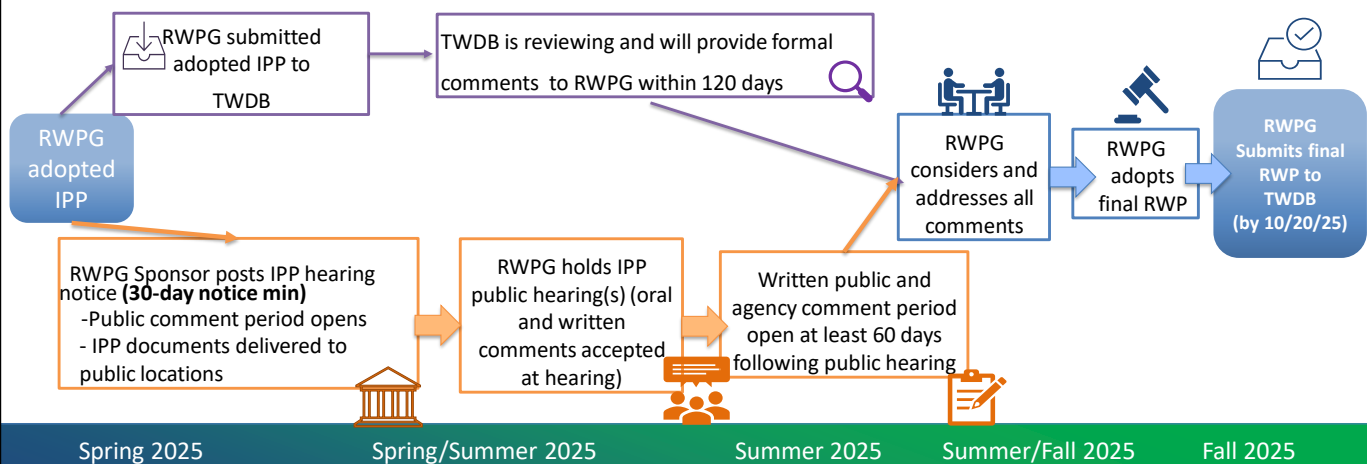

On February 27, 2025, the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) received the adopted Initially Prepared Plan (IPP) for Contract No. 2148302560 (Region H). As required by Section II, Article III, Item F of the referenced contract, the TWDB has received:

- two double-sided copies of the IPP,
- one electronic copy of the IPP in searchable PDF, and
- one electronic copy in Microsoft Word.

TWDB staff have completed an administrative review of the IPP and found the deliverable to be administratively complete in accordance with Contract Exhibit C, Section 2.12.2. Congratulations on completing this major deliverable!

Staff will begin reviewing the IPP to determine that it meets all statutory, rule, and contract requirements. TWDB anticipates providing the region with a preliminary draft version of TWDB review comments in early June. Regions will then have one week to provide any feedback to the TWDB. The TWDB's final review comments will be issued by **June 27, 2025**.

The state water planning database will be locked down after **March 4, 2025** as part of TWDB's IPP data review and for the remainder of the planning cycle. If data changes are necessary for your region, please contact TWDB's Water Supply and Strategy Analysis team at rwpdataentry@twdb.texas.gov and staff will assist in making appropriate database changes.

As a reminder, the deadline for planning groups to assert that a potential interregional conflict exists is 60 days following submittal of the IPP. Based on the IPP submittal date, the deadline for your region is **April 28, 2025**. If your planning group believes that an interregional conflict exists, the following information must be submitted in writing to the TWDB Executive Administrator and the other affected planning group, per 31 Texas Administrative Code § 357.50(d):

- identification of the specific recommended water management strategy from another RWPG's IPP;
- a statement of why the RWPG considers there to be an interregional conflict; and
- any other information available to the RWPG that is relevant to the Board's decision.

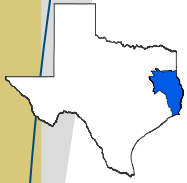
